

# Hazard Management Register

- Identify all hazards on the property. Start with hazards that pose the highest risk and work from there.
- Classify the likelihood and significance of the hazard. A significant hazard can cause serious harm, including death, amputation, fractures, serious burns, repeat exposure injury/illness.
- Identify if the hazard can be mitigated, isolated or eliminated.
- Outline any preventative action, training or information required to manage the risk.
- Review each hazard regularly and ensure it is being well managed. Update the register when risks have been reviewed, new equipment is purchased, processes change, or new risks are identified.

## Eliminate (E)

Remove the hazard from the workplace, e.g. hang hoses in the pit to eliminate trip hazard.

## Isolate (I)

Prevent people coming into contact with the hazard, e.g. fencing off hazardous areas.

## Minimise (M)

Reduce the risk (e.g. training, process change), minimise exposure, use personal protective equipment.
